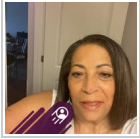

“ Mr. John worked with us at Crittenton since December 2023. Responsible for managing the front desk on his shift, he was the first person our employees, residents, and guests would see and interact with. He gave everyone a warm welcome with his wide smile and friendly greeting. Always dressed to impress with a stylish top hat, he made everyone who called or walked through our doors feel comfortable and safe. He expressed a genuine concern for our residents and staff. He made an effort to get to know you, and in turn shared interesting details of his own life: he attended Western Union High School, an all-black school in Union County that is now an elementary school; he spent time in the military and he loved being stationed in Germany. He spoke highly of his family and was very proud of them. He admired actor Sidney Poitier and enjoyed his movie "To Sir, With Love." You could usually tell when he was working because you could hear the lively variety of music he would play at the front desk. And his announcements over our PA system always made everyone chuckle - his voice had a slight militaristic rigidity but fatherly tone. He gave me the same greeting every day when I got to work when I would say "Good morning Mr. John, how are you today?" he always answered with his big smile "I'm still here!"
